BASIC AND EXPERIENCED MOTORCYCLE RIDER COURSE

Refund Policy

Due to this course being limited in size (12) and a self-sustaining course, if you wish to cancel your class or reschedule you must call the office and make that request no later than 12:00 Noon on the Thursday prior to your class. We accept payment by Cash, Master Card or Visa. No checks are accepted. There is a 10% cancellation fee if you have paid by credit card and need to cancel your class. **If you fail or drop out for any reason, and wish to retake the class you must take the entire class over and pay the total fee (BRC-\$165 or ERC-\$75) again.** When deciding to take either course, keep in mind that much of the course is taught outside. Weather and physical exertion are factors to be considered, so please take this into consideration before registering.

Student Information

Student schedules are subject to bike and teacher availability. If there is a problem we will try to notify you in advance.

1. **ATTENDANCE: 100% attendance is required for course completion. If you arrive late, or if you are absent during the presentation of any of the material or exercise, you will not be allowed to continue the course and will be asked to leave. NO REFUND WILL BE GIVEN.**

2. **CLASS SCHEDULE**

The class will break for lunch approximately one hour each day. Please bring water or a non-alcoholic beverage to drink while you are out on the range.

3. **MOTORCYCLE OPERATOR'S LICENSE ENDORSEMENT IS NOT INSUR UPON COMPLETION OF THE COURSE.** You will need to take a copy of your completion card to the Texas Department of Public Safety office. If they will not accept the copy call the Motorcycle Safety Bureau at 1-800-292-5787 to confirm that you have taken the course. At the DPS office you will take the vision and written test. You must pass both of these tests before you can receive your license. This course provides excellent preparation for the DPS required written test.
4. **REQUIRED ATTIRE:** All students will spend a large portion of Saturday and Sunday riding the motorcycles that are provided. While operating the motorcycles, the students will be required to wear the following:
 - a. Helmets that are properly fitted and secure. If you have a motorcycle helmet and it is DOT approved, bring it. If you do not own a helmet, there are loan helmets available.
 - b. Full finger gloves (half or cut-off-finger gloves are not acceptable). Student must provide.
 - c. Eye protection in the form of sunglasses, goggles, helmets, or corrective eyeglasses. Shatterproof lenses are strongly recommended for all types of eye protection. Eye protection is not available for loan.
 - d. Long-sleeved shirt or jacket. Denim or leather with close fitting cuffs is preferred.
 - e. Long pants of sturdy material such as denim.
 - f. Low heeled boots or sturdy shoes that **cover** the ankles.
5. **MINORS:** Minors under 18 years of age **must have a Restricted License or Permit** before they will be allowed to take this motorcycle course. **A Restricted License or Permit** must be produced upon registration. Furthermore, minors must have a parent or legal guardian sign a form allowing the instructor to provide first aid or obtain medical treatment should it become necessary to do so. This form must be turned in to the

instructor before the minor will be allowed to operate the motorcycles provided. Minors are required to have taken and passed this course before a Motorcycle Operator's license will be granted by the DPS. Again, only the vision and written test for motorcycles will still have to be taken and passed at the DPS office before a motorcycle license is issued.

6. **WEATHER:** This course will not be canceled for rain. If you own rainwear, bring it. If the weather is warm, the instructors recommend you wear light colored clothed. We will ride unless weather is severe and threatens the safety of the students and instructors. Please check media for SBISD school closures as this applies to Motorcycle Safety Class also.
7. **COUNSELING:** From time to time, it is necessary for an instructor to counsel a student into leaving the course (without refund) prior to completion. The primary reason this becomes necessary is that the student's lack of proficiency may pose a threat to themselves or to other students. Behavior which poses a threat to safety comes in many forms including but not limited to:
 - a. **NOT following instructions.**
 - b. Not developing in a reasonable amount of time with a reasonable amount of the instructors' attention, the skills necessary to conduct the exercises safely.

THE INSTRUCTOR IS THE SOLE JUDGE OF UNSAFE BEHAVIOR

Effective Sept. 1, 1995, the legislature has made the Advanced Motorcycle Operator Training Course (ERC) equivalent to the defensive driving course for purposes of dismissing traffic citations issued to motorcyclists. Community Education at SBISD offers this course.

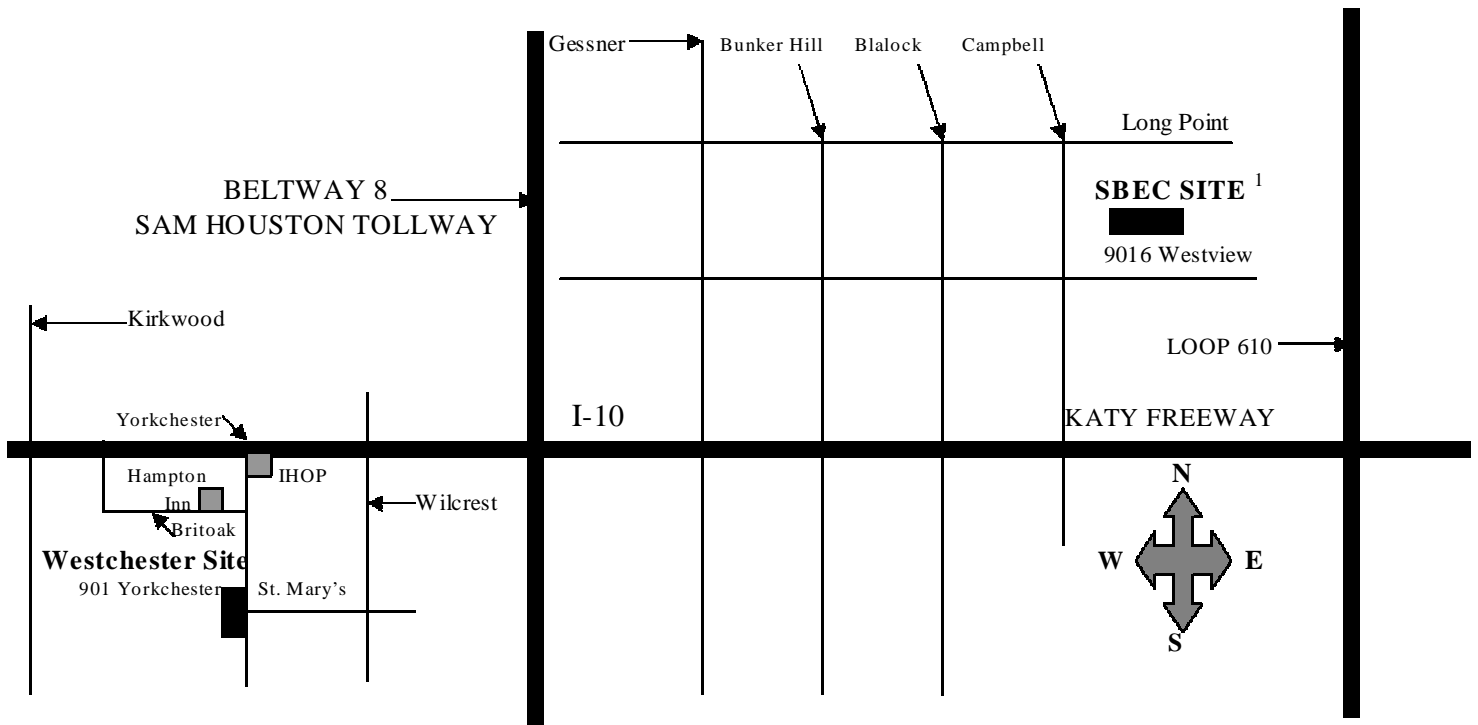

THE Katy Freeway (I-10 W), exit on Campbell Rd. and go north. The second stoplight is Westview. Turn right and the third structure on the left is SBEC. Turn down the driveway on the west side of the campus and drive to the back of the campus. Enter the building under the sign SBISD Community Education. The office is the first door on the left, E106. **Classroom (G-103) is located in the back of SBEC near the trash bins at the south end of the athletic field. Please arrive on time. You will not be admitted to class if you are late. This strict attendance policy is mandated by the state.**
